

Health Services Director

Preble Street Health Services, in partnership with Greater Portland Health (GPH) and Maine Medical Center (MMC), offers health care and social work services to community members who are experiencing homelessness and poverty. To develop, coordinate and manage these evolving programs and partnerships, we are seeking a **Health Services Director**. The Health Services Director will lead our efforts to provide accessible, quality health care services to the most vulnerable members of our community through:

- Working with MMC and GPH partners to support delivery of quality medical and social work services.
- Building and maintaining relationships, partnerships, and collaborations with multiple stakeholders
- Grant and fiscal management.
- Developing and implementing program policies and procedures.
- Providing technical assistance and community linkages to team members.
- Assisting with research and evaluation efforts.
- Leading and assisting with education and training efforts.
- Participating in agency advocacy efforts through providing expertise in health care-related systems and access issues.
- Overseeing evolving programs in partnership with both GPH and MMC, as well as collaborations with other Preble Street programs.
- Supervising Health Services management staff, and other Health Services staff as needed.

Requirements

Preferred qualifications include a Master of Social Work or related degree, as well as experience in staff supervision, direct service provision, grant and contract management, program development, and working as a member of a multi-disciplinary team.

Knowledge, skills and abilities required for the position include: an in-depth knowledge and dedication to Preble Street's mission, philosophy and social work practice; an understanding of issues related to community health practices and policies, specifically as they relate to homelessness and health care access; project management skills, with the ability to work independently on multiple assignments; strong interpersonal and communications skills; the ability to develop and foster productive relationships and collaborative partnerships; and the ability to engage and create strong relationships with individuals experiencing chronic homelessness individuals.
